Considering aRabbit Project?

Keep in mind the following project descriptions and requirements for a Ottawa County 4-H Rabbit Project.

- The Pet Rabbit project is meant for <u>household pets</u> living in the home or mixed breed animals. It is not exhibited at the fair
- The Breeding Rabbit project is for any purebred rabbit and it does <u>not</u> mean you need to breed the rabbit.
- The Market Rabbit project is a pen of three rabbits sold at the Ottawa County Fair.
- · There are 49 recognized rabbit breeds.
- Rabbits can be raised in town or in the country & is a relatively inexpensive project.

Members must:

- ☐ Enroll in 4-H by the April 1st Deadline
- ☐ Purchase the animal by deadline listed in fairbook
- ☐ Rabbit tattoo date will be announced.
- ☐ Attend Quality Assurance training (excluding pet rabbit)
- ☐ Complete Project Book and attend Livestock Judging and Skill-a-thon (July)
- ☐ Bring rabbit to the Fair at scheduled check in time

Equipment & Cost Considerations

- Space required: Cage suited to size of your chosen breed. Ranges from 18"x24" to 30" x 36"
- Very few breeds should be housed on a solid floor surface
- · Costs of Rabbits can vary
- Cost of feeds can vary
- A clean continuous water supply is needed
- · Cages must always be out of the sun





Exhibiting a Rabbit Project

- A 4-H member will be able to show rabbits in showmanship, market, or breed show class
- Showmanship is a recommended class as it shows what you have learned during the project. It is encouraged, but not required.
- Market projects weights are listed in the Jr. Fair Handbook

Items needed for the fair:

- Brushes
- · Spray bottle
- Shampoo
- Frozen water bottles
- Food

Dress code: White, long sleeved shirt or lab coat. Pants with no holes. No open toed shoes.

Possession/Breeding Dates

- Breeding: 4-H members must own no later than May 1st
- **Market:** Not older than 69 days old as of the fair.
