# **New Family Guide to 4-H**

## What Does My Child's 4-H Club Expect From Me?

- 1. Attend club meetings, activities and events with your child. Notify the club advisor if your child can't attend a meeting/activity.
- 2. Help with the club fundraising events and pay your child's club dues if applicable.
- 3. Attend special events planned by the 4-H club.
- 4. Encourage and guide your child's project work. Don't do their work.
- 5. Read the 4-H newsletter, emails, and other information with your child. Use the Ottawa County 4-H website for information: ottawa.osu.edu or Facebook-**Ohio State- Ottawa County 4-H**
- 6. Encourage your child to participate in project judging, clinics/workshops, 4-H camp(s), older youth opportunities, Junior Fair events, and much more.
- 7. Encourage your child to keep up-to-date records & complete project.
- 8. Model a positive attitude, good sportsmanship, respect and cooperation.
- 9. Assist with 4-H club activities in your areas of interest and expertise. Teach a project skill, help with a community service project, plan a field trip, assist with fundraising, etc.
- 10. Help the club. Host a meeting, provide refreshments, sponsor an award.
- 11. Support the club by cooperating with club advisors and exhibiting a positive attitude towards your child's personal and club 4-H goals.

# What Should I Expect From My 4-H Club and Advisors?

- 1. Notice of 4-H club meetings and/or a printed schedule of club meetings for the year.
- 2. Information provided at one of the first meetings:
  - 4-H Family Guide
  - Meeting Dates, Upcoming important dates
  - Enrollment (Online) directions
- 3. Information provided at all meetings:
  - Review of the 4-H Calendar, 4-H Newsletter or Recent Mailings from the Extension Office
  - Reminders of Upcoming Deadlines, Requirements, etc.
- 4. Help in selecting & receiving Project Books for my child.
- 5. Hands-on learning experiences for my child... project work, demonstrations, etc.
- 6. Opportunity for my child to give back to the community through service projects... flower gardens at the fairgrounds, picking up trash, etc. Each club may do something different.







- 7. Opportunity for my child to build leadership skills through serving as a club officer, on a committee, leading the American or 4-H pledges, participating in a business meeting, etc.
- 8. Opportunity for my child to have FUN with friends (new and old) through recreational, social, educational and/or competitive activities.
- 9. A welcoming place for my child and I to learn and grow through the 4-H Program and work together to "Make the Best Better".

#### What Will 4-H Cost?

- ☑ **Club Fees/Dues** Some clubs charge a per member fee based on their club's activities. Club fees may be used towards refreshments, project book cost, fair pass, club t-shirt, etc. Ask your club advisor about their club fees/dues.
- ☑ **Project Books** Most project books cost \$8.00. Some projects require an additional Resource Handbook (\$10.00 to \$21.00) that is purchased once by the family and used by all family members. Check with your 4-H advisor for current project book costs.
- ☑ **Project Items** Every project has some costs beyond the 4-H project book. For some projects, this may be supplies and materials that you already have at home. For other projects, your child will be required to invest in an animal & supplies for its care, specialized equipment and/or other items. Please keep this in mind when selecting projects with your child.
- ☑ **Fair** If members plan to participate in the fair, they will have some additional costs associated with their 4-H experience. 4-H members who complete their project do get a wristband for admission into the fair for the week.
